Forays in Asia

Fellows Neil Henry in China and Dick Hardham in Veitnam have brought back impressions of the practice of dentistry in those two countries.

Neil found great contrasts within that enormous nation ranging from state-of-the-art to old time traditional Chinese remedies. His attempts to arouse interest in international participation proved unsuccessful.

Dick was at the first international congress to be held in Ho Chi Minh City. Lecturers included Fellows **Graham Mount** and **Kevin Allen**. John Cooney of Sydney also spoke.

As in China, contrasts were abundant and opportunities for assistance available for those interested.

College Projects

The President has made a call for fresh initiatives to continue the College tradition of affording assistance to the profession in areas not normally

covered by other agencies. At the last Board meeting a grant was approved to help support an inaugural Student Overseas Elective Program in the Asian Pacific Region. The concept behind this student exchange scheme is to promote continuing education in our own region.

The inaugural scheme targets the dental schools of Hong Kong and Adelaide. Later the other Australian schools would participate on a rotating arrangement with a specific Asian Pacific school to be targeted each year.

The College is a co-sponsor of the scheme whose participation will be appropriately acknowledged.

It does not follow that the contribution be an annual one. Each state would organise its own sponsorship with the possibility of a future approach from a different source.

It was felt that the international flavour of the scheme combined with the promotion of dentistry and dental education fell well within the ideals of the International College of Dentists.
