### PRESIDENT'S REPORT



This year has seen a changeover in the executive of the Australasian Section of the College. After two years of strong and directed leadership, Clive Ross (NZ) has completed his presidential term. Clive ordinarily would remain on the Board of Regents for a term as Immediate Past

President, but we have additionally secured his continued service in the post of International Councillor following the resignation of Geoff Hall. Clive brings to the Board a wealth of experience in dental administration, from both the NZDA and FDI arenas.

**Geoff Hall** has been one of the most outstanding contributors in the story of our Section. Though we accept his resignation as International Councillor, and thus as a Board member, with regret, it is also marked with appreciation for, and recognition of the major part he has played in this Section for many years. Geoff's quiet demeanour is a foil to his depth of intelligence and leadership. He has

been an 'anchor man' of good counsel and encouragement for many years. As International Councillor he forthrightly represented our area in the labyrinthine workings of the International Council, not an easy task, considering the complexity of factions of this world College. At the March Convocation, his achievement was marked by presentation of a unique Certificate of Appreciation.

As incoming President, I am delighted to have a most able executive team in Gerry Dickinson (Vic) as Vice-President, Peter Noblet (SA) as Treasurer, Dick Cook (WA) as Editor and Jackie Robinson (NSW) our ever consistent and industrious Registrar. Gerry has served as Treasurer since 2001, an appointment he has conducted with his characteristically thorough and dependable ability. Jackie Robinson, as Registrar, is the 'engine room' of the Section, contributing her organisational skills and creativity to bring a new dimension to that position.

We welcome Jenny Smyth, as a second Queensland representative, to the Board. Jenny has profound and recognised experience in both dental education and administration. Her presence on the Board will add perspective together with her very individual enthusiasm.

The Sydney Convocation marked a dramatic and perhaps unanticipated elevation in its success. This was due to the attendance of the International President, Don Johnson, from the United States. Don is a towering figure, both in his stature - he has a tall and commanding presence - and in the strength of his dedication to the progress of the College. Earlier in the day he participated in the Board of Regents meeting. He presented a



'dissertation' on the aims and processes of the US Section and the International Council that was nothing short of inspiring. He is a patrician in the best sense, in that he has ultimate respect for past achievements, but is courageous and resolute in initiating overhaul and restructure of the International Council. One of his priorities in the reorganisation of the international office is to reform its communication with and support of the constituent Sections.

In concluding this report I want to pay tribute to the contribution of Rob Butler, who now leaves the Board at the end of his term as Immediate Past President. I have had a long association with Rob, not only in the ICD, but also at Westmead Hospital where both Jackie Robinson and I worked under his Directorship. He then of course broadened his experience as CEO of ADA Inc.

As a member of the Board, and in the positions of executive responsibility, Rob has been a source of consistent, sound and educated advice. His leadership and guidance in all matters will be missed, but I imagine we will still call on him from time to time.

I look forward to a productive term, particularly in the support of those who take dental health and education to people of need, particularly to Australian Indigenous communities and to those of Asia and the Pacific.
